The Gloucestershire LINK has legal duties and powers and will act in agreement with the

Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007.

Find out what people like and dislike about local Health and Social Care Services

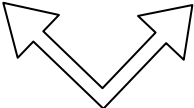


Look into matters of concern
